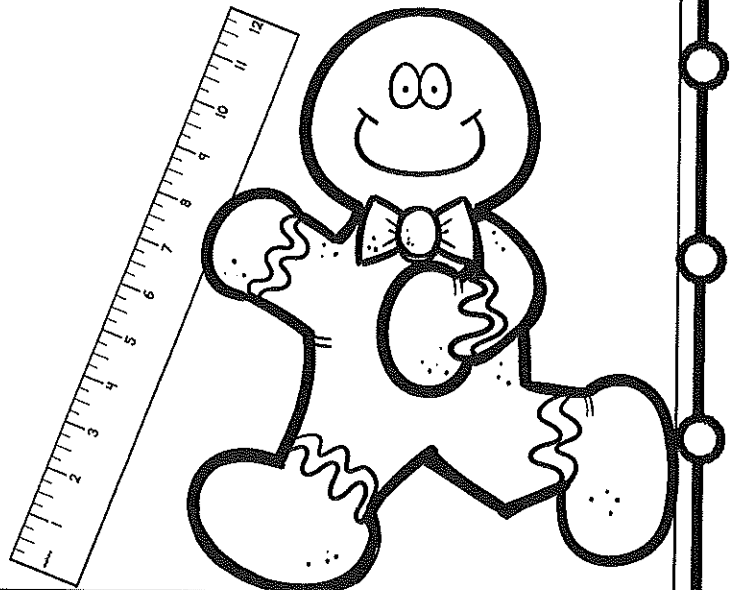
BUILD A GUMDROP TOWER

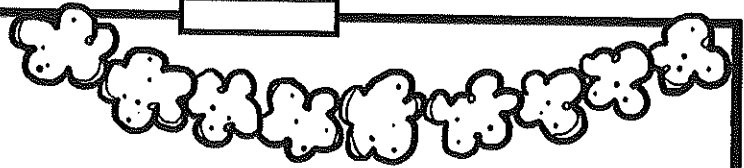
You may not use any other materials besides the ones listed below. There are many different ways to complete this challenge. Get Creative! I cannot wait to see what you do!

The two siblings set out until finally they stumbled on the perfect one.

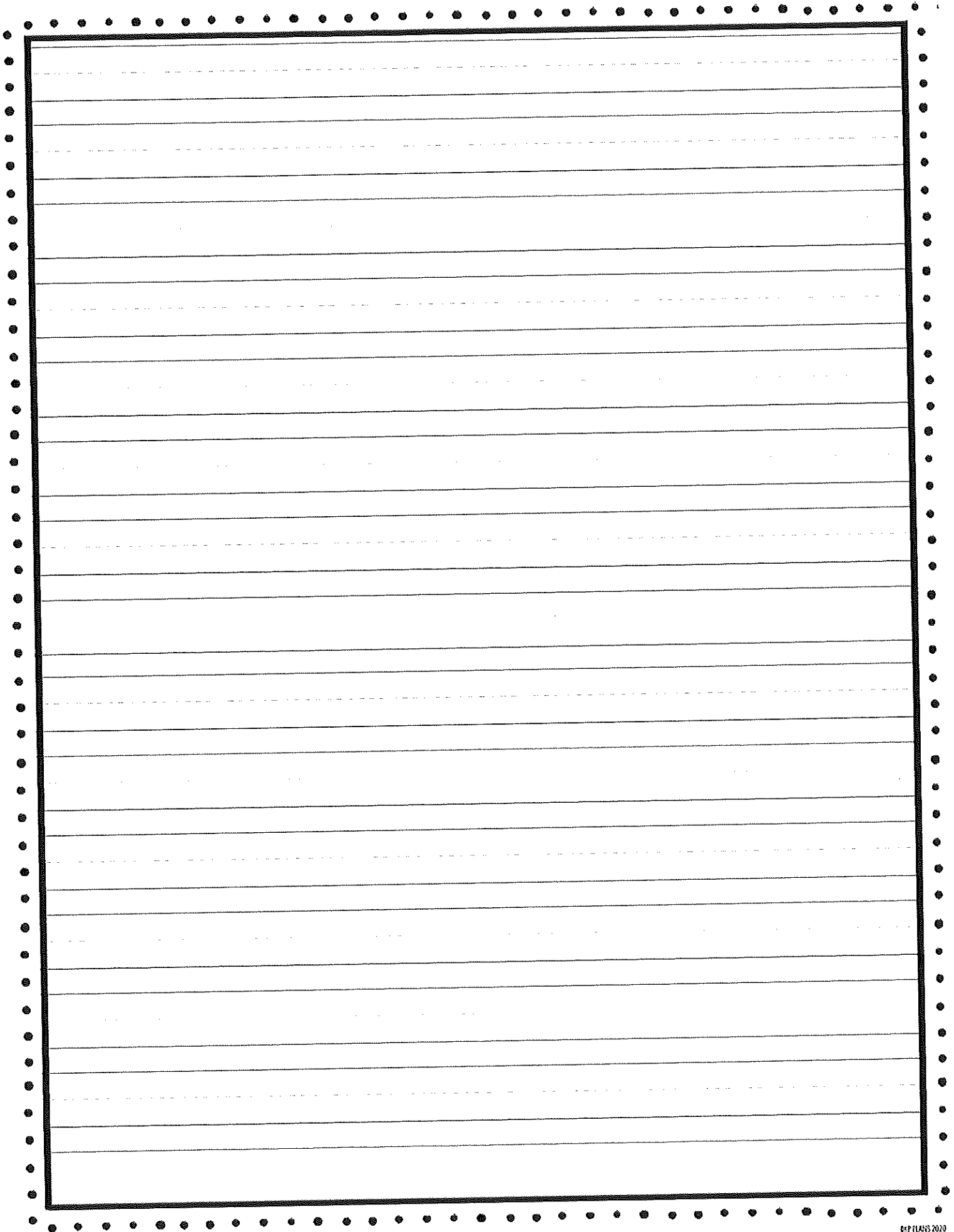
"This one seems big, but not too big," Mark said.

"Yes! And the branches are nice and full so I can put so many ornaments and lights on them," Meredith responded.

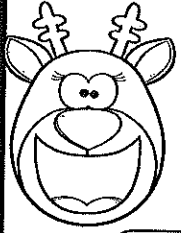
"Let's get this one!" the two kids shouted.
